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Introduction

Pupil Premium is additional funding allocated to schools by the government for supporting pupils to ensure that they benefit from the same opportunities as all other children. There are 3 categories of children that qualify for a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG):

- Children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Looked After Children (have been looked after for 1 day or more; are adopted; leave care under a Special Guardianship Order or a Residence order)
- Armed Forces children

For service children, it has been identified nationally that there may be a need to provide additional care, guidance and support due to the nature of these children's lifestyles.

Please Note:

To ensure our Pupil Premium children are not easily identifiable, we will not be publishing some of the more detailed aspects of Pupil Premium information on our website.

DfE Guidance:

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium Grant is spent as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils at their school.

Evendons Pupil Premium Strategy:

Evendons Primary School Evendons Primary School offers a positive, safe learning environment for its community, in which everyone has equal and individual recognition and respect. At Evendons, we have high aspirations and ambitions for our children and we believe that no child should be left behind. We strongly believe that it is not about where you come from or the circumstances you are challenged by, but your passion and thirst for knowledge, and your dedication and commitment to learning that make the difference between success and failure, and we are determined to ensure that our children are given every chance to realise their full potential. The strategy that we take to ensure we are 'Diminishing the Difference' for our Pupil Premium children focuses on the following key areas:

Wellbeing

Attendance

Assessment

Achievement

How will Evendons Primary School know if your child attracts this additional school funding?

We will be collecting new information from parents of children at Evendons prior to their start date. We will specifically ask you if your child falls into one of the above three categories. In addition to any current eligibility for FSM, families who have been eligible at any time in the past 6 years should inform us as their child will attract additional funding for our school. We refer to this as EVER 6.

How do I know if we are, or have ever been eligible for FSM?

The Department for Education states:

Your child may be eligible to get free school meals if you get any of the following: Income Support

- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit
- Children who get any of the above benefits in their own right (ie they get benefits payments directly, instead of through a parent or guardian) can also get free school meals.
- Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be able to get free school meals.

If you think your child is entitled to free school meals, you'll usually need to fill in an application form you

can get from your local council [or school]. Give your completed application to your child's school and make sure you can show documentary proof of any support you get.

How might Evendons Primary School spend this additional funding to support pupils?

Our pupil premium money will be utilised in a range of ways that we believe will have the greatest impact on those who are entitled to receive this additional funding. The decisions are driven by the school leadership team and are based upon careful discussions, observations, assessment and monitoring. In collaboration with practitioners, leaders analyse the school data each term and make recommendations for the expenditure. The funding is used to provide a range of additional support for our children and our intention is that these specific interventions will have a significant impact on children's learning and progress and so their attainment.

Whilst we believe that effectively differentiated Quality First Teaching is crucial and ensures success and progress, we also understand the importance of targeted, precision intervention. As such, we use a range of intervention strategies to provide children with the additional support and challenge that they need in order to accelerate progress and for some children to eliminate barriers to learning so they are equipped with the tools, skills and experience they need to reach age related expectations and as they move through the school. Targeted support is being provided through one- to-one and small group tuition. These interventions support children in knowing where they are and what they need to do to improve their work.

In September 2019 Evendons appointed a Nurture and Wellbeing lead in school. This designated person will be responsible for mentoring, coaching, pastoral support, 1:1 academic support, reviewing assessments, conducting IPM's with parents termly, creating, supporting transition and ensuring that effective interventions are in place for those children who need support. In September 2020, and in light of Covid19 and the school closure in March 2020, Evendons appointed a Specialist tutor who delivers sessions to support children to catch up with their peers and help children close specific gaps in their learning.

Other support includes:

- Staff Training
- Funds to assist in accessing to extracurricular clubs (Music tuition)
- Fund to assist in accessing breakfast and afterschool club,
- Funding places on educational visits, including residential visits
- Educational Psychology assessments and support from outside agencies, when needed
- Staff training to ensure whole school approach
- Books and resources to support specific children, including uniform
- Specific Intervention support from TA's
- Specialist support e.g. occupational therapist or speech and language therapy
- Art Therapy.

The impact

- Effective and speedy assessment of needs reducing negative impact on learning
- More than expected progress over the year for the vast majority of children
- Smooth transition into school with emphasis on reducing the negative impact on learning and wellbeing
- Excellent pastoral support for children with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties improving wellbeing and minimising disruptions to learning

Monitoring and Evaluation

Evendons Primary School will monitor and evaluate the impact of this provision on each child's progress during each term and review accordingly. Evaluation will consider impact on academic attainment and progress and pupils' wellbeing.
