




Here we are trying to see which house group can throw the javelin the furthest.



Reading

What is Libby?

Libby is a free app where you can borrow ebooks, digital audiobooks, and magazines from your public library. You can stream titles with Wi-Fi or mobile data, or download them for offline use and read anytime, anywhere. All you need to get started is a library card.



Wokingham libraries have launched a <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u>. We highly recommend that all our children take part in this.

Primary school children can sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge and have fun with reading over the holidays!

There are two ways you can take part in the Summer Reading Challenge:


You can join at your local library and take part in person. The librarian will give you a collector folder, stickers, and other special rewards, and help you find books to read.

Or, take part online by signing up <u>here</u>. Set a reading goal and log your books on your profile. When you reach your goal you will unlock a virtual badge and certificate!

Please note, the in-person and online Challenges are separate. Physical incentives like medals and certificates are only available via the library, for those taking part in the in-person Challenge.

The White Rose 1 Minute Maths app is free to download and is suitable for children in all year groups. It is a great resource to help maintain children's arithmetic skills over the holidays.

All children in Y2 - Y6 have a <u>TT Rockstars log in</u> and children are encouraged to log in regularly over the holidays to keep up their Times Tables recall!



School Fund Donations

As a result of increasing costs and reduced funding for all schools, it is becoming increasingly difficult to finance the items we wish to provide the school in order to enrich our children's learning environment.

Free School Meals

Note: this is separate to *Universal Infant Free School Meals*, which is the provision of free lunches for all children in Reception to Year 2. Your child may qualify for free meals for the duration of their Primary years. It takes
